Paine convenes an annual meeting to inform and distribute the School Parent and Family Engagement Policy and information about school programs including, the requirement for parent and community participation and their rights to give input. Our annual meeting is held during Back to School Night each year or in the first month of school.

Paine provides parent opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and participate in decisions relating to the education of their children. We will hold a flexible number of meetings for parents offered in the morning and after school hours to make it accessible for all parents. Childcare can be provided upon request for parents needing it.

Our school utilizes our SSC to jointly develop and publish the SPFE policy to plan, review, and revise our SPSA. In addition, our SPSA has been developed with the review, certification, and advice of the school English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC). Our SSC is comprised of representatives from each stakeholder group as required in EC Section 65000[c][1] and follows the meeting requirement and procedures set forth in EC Section 35147. Teachers meet with parents at minimum three times a year to provide information on student progress and ways they can support their child. Curriculum, state standards and progress monitoring are discussed at both formal and informal parent conferences and parent trainings.

Parents are given a survey at the site level and by the district to get input that informs measures put in place at Paine. The principal receive training from the K-12 Educational Services, whereas teachers get training at staff meetings on how to work with parents as equal partners.
